#### Notes from Hades

y wife and I just got back from a wonderful vacation in Great Britain and Ireland. I will now proceed to tell you about it, whether you want me to or not. We arrived at Heathrow Airport in the early afternoon on the 6th, got our

car, and drove to a town called Bury St. Edmunds, which is about half an hour's drive east of Cambridge. A good friend of Celeste's lives there and she and her husband graciously allowed us to stay with them. The next day we saw Cambridge, or at least as much of it as time allowed, and then we drove down to Brentwood to meet Murray Cowles and his wife Bernie. After having a cup of tea with them, Murray, Celeste and I then met with Chris Geggus for dinner. It was great meeting with the two of them, and the occasion was marred only by the fact that Chris's wife and kids had some kind of viral infection, so we couldn't meet with them as well.

The next day we headed off for York, arriving in the early afternoon. We checked into our bed and breakfast (the only way to stay in Britain) and toured the town. York has a wonderful museum, called "A Museum of Everyday Life" which has full scale replicas of streets as they would have been in the 18th Century, and an exhibit on the history of chocolate. The following day we visited a place called Eden Camp, which is a former World War II POW camp which has been converted into a museum. Each of the huts has exhibits based on a particular theme. For instance, one of the huts showed what a typical street would be like during the war (complete with smells), and another mimicked a German U-boat being attacked by depth charges. Definitely a must-see for anyone interested in WWII history. From there, we continued north to Edinburgh.

Edinburgh was our favorite city of the trip. Even though the Edinburgh festival had just completed, the city was clean and the people were unfailingly friendly. In fact, I would have to say that the Scots were easily the friendliest people we met on the trip. We spent a day walking around Edinburgh, mainly on "The Royal Mile", which is the stretch between Holyrood Palace and Edinburgh Castle, both of which were wonderful.

The next day, we headed off to Stirling. While we didn't get a chance to see the Wallace Monument, we did see Stirling Castle and the site of the Battle of Bannockburn, where Robert the Bruce defeated King Edward II, securing Scottish independence. We continued on to the Lake District and the city of Windemere. We spent the next morning at Hill Top, which was Beatrix Potter's house. Beatrix Potter, for those of you who don't know, was a writer of children's stories, the most famous of which is The Tale of Peter Rabbit. She used the house as a model for many of the illustrations in her later books. After that, we drove to Holyhead in Whales to catch the ferry to Ireland.

We spent that next day touring Dublin. Dublin suffered in comparison with Edinburgh. It was dirtier and the people weren't nearly as friendly. Even so, we saw some wonderful things there. There is a museum called Dublinia, which describes medieval Dublin, which was quite interesting. And, of course, there was the Guinness Hopstore, were you got to see a display on how Guinness is made. And, of course, the tour ends at the bar where you get to sample the goods.

Monday, we drove out into the countryside, saw Cashel and stayed that night in a farmhouse. That evening we got the best meal of the trip to that point. My wife enjoyed walking around the farm, which was an actual working farm with thoroughbred horses, dairy cattle, sheep, and a pig. The next day we went to Cahir Castle, which was used in the filming of Excalibur, and from there to Waterford for a tour of the Waterford Crystal Factory. We went to the Irish Heritage Museum north of Wexford, which is an outdoor museum

## **Pedagoguery**

Uranus is the first planet to have been discovered with the aid of a telescope. It sits just on the edge of naked eye visibility, and in fact it was mistaken for a star several times before it was realized that it was in fact a planet. William Herschel discovered it in 1781, but little was known of it until this century, particularly until the visit by Voyager 2 in 1986.

Like Jupiter and Saturn, Uranus a gas giant, which means it is primarily made up of lighter gasses. It probably has a rocky core, surrounded by a layer of metallic hydrogen. It is from this layer that its magnetic field arises. Outside that layer is a layer of gasses that behave like a liquid due to the immense pressure. As you continue up, the pressure steadily drops, and the material starts to behave in a more and more gaseous manner. This continues until the cloud tops are reached.

Uranus is the smallest of the gas giants, with a diameter of only 4 times that of Earth, or just over a third of Jupiter's diameter. It presents a nearly featureless face to the universe, just a placid blue-green. The color probably results from large amounts of methane in the atmosphere. Even so, there are many oddities about this planet.

Uranus is a world on its side. It has an axial tilt of 98 degrees, which means that its south pole lies in the northern half of the solar system (as defined by the Sun's north and south poles). This is by far the most extreme axial tilt of any known planet, and it tells us that Uranus has some rather extreme seasons. Its distance from the Sun gives it a year that is 84 Earth years long, and its axial tilt means that each pole spends about 40 Earth years in alternating light and darkness. These extreme cycles mean that the polar regions actually receive more solar heat that the equator. This could explain why Voyager detected winds in excess of 720 km/h (450 mph), despite the fact that Uranus appears to lack an internal heat source.

Another oddity of Uranus is its magnetic field. The magnetic field is offset from the rotation axis by a full 59 degrees. This would be like having the north magnetic pole of Earth located in Austin, Texas. Furthermore, the center of the field is well offset from the center of the planet – about a third of the way out from the center. This means that as Uranus turns, the magnetic field twists and turns in relation to the solar wind.

Uranus was known to have rings before the Voyager encounter. They were discovered in 1977 when Uranus occulted a star. An occultation occurs when one object passes in front of another object in the sky. This particular occultation was eagerly observed because it would give astronomers valuable information about the outer portion of Uranus' atmosphere. It ended up giving them much more. As the planet approached the star, the star suddenly started blinking slightly, a total of nine times. Then, after the planet moved out from in front of the star, it blinked nine times again in the same pattern as before, only reversed. This pointed to nine thin rings of some dark matter circling the planet. Voyager later confirmed this. Two more rings have since been discovered. The configuration of the rings was puzzling to astronomers. This is because, left to itself, any ring would slowly broaden and dissipate. So, how did Uranus' rings remain so narrow? The answer was believed to be the presence of shepherd moons. These would be small moons orbiting on either side of the ring. The gravity of the moons would keep the ring particles in the ring, thus preventing the ring from broadening. Voyager did in fact find two such moons around the brightest of Uranus' rings, the epsilon ring. These two innermost of Uranus' moons, now called Cordelia and Ophelia, were the only shepherd moons found.

Uranus was known to have five moons before the Voyager encounter. Unlike the other planets, these moons were named after characters in the plays of William Shakespeare and Alexander Pope. Voyager added 10 more to that total. All of the moons found by Voyager are small, unremarkable rocks, the largest of them being Portia at 110 km (70 mi.) in diameter. They are, from closest to farthest: Cordelia, Ophelia, Bianca, Cressida, Desdimona, Juliet, Portia, Rosalind, Belinda, and Puck. After that we reach the five pre-Voyager moons: Miranda, Ariel, Umbriel, Titania, and Oberon.

All five of the moons have many things in common. They are all made up of a mixture of ice and rock, probably a ratio of three parts ice to two parts rock, slightly higher in the case of Miranda. From there, many differences emerge.

Miranda is the smallest of the five, and it was discovered very recently, in 1948. It is in many ways the most surprising of the moons. It has considerable areas of strange, grooved terrain called coronae. To this day, it is still not known what the cause of this terrain is. Theories range from expansion caused by freezing liquid water (how liquid water got there to begin with is still a mystery) to one in which Miranda is the result of a fairly recent collision between smaller satellites that stuck. Until more close-range observations are made, there will be no way of telling for sure.

Ariel and Umbriel are the next further out, and they have a lot in common. They were both discovered in 1851 and they both show similar features. They have appreciable numbers of craters, but they are all smaller craters. Craters larger than 50 km (31 mi.) appear to have been erased, perhaps due to a period of tectonic activity. Once again, there appears to be no good explanation for such activity.

Titania and Oberon are the largest and most distant of the moons. Discovered in 1787 by William Herschel, they are mostly unsurprising. They do have surface cracks and canyons which seem to indicate that they have been expanding by about 1 to 2 percent. This could be accounted for by the expansion of freezing water, but once again, how would liquid water get out there?

In 1997, two additional moons were discovered around Uranus. Unlike the other 15, they have highly eccentric orbits. Little more is known about them.

Next issue, we move on to Neptune.
