Notes from Hades s I mentioned in last issue, Celeste and I have been going through some IVF (that is, in vitro

fertilization) treatments. The first time was last December, and the net result was 14 embryos. We implanted 5 and froze the remaining 9. Nothing happened. We then unfroze the 9. Seven of nine (the number, not the former borg from ST: Voyager) survived, and we implanted all seven. Once again, nothing. So, we took a couple of months off before trying again. Our second full attempt started at the end of June. This time, we got only 9 embryos, but these seemed to be better quality than the first batch. After two days, they had outgrown where the first batch had been after three days. (Incidentally, it's kind of weird to see embryos at that stage - they look like clusters of soap bubbles.) We had originally intended to implant 7, but the doctor told us that there was little point in freezing the remaining two, since those were the weakest of the batch (only 2 cells apiece, all the rest were either 4- or 5-cell embryos) the chances of them surviving the freezing process were slim. So, we decided to implant all nine. That was on July 12. Then came the waiting. It would take about two weeks before we would know if it worked this time. As it turned out, we found out a little early. On the evening of the 23rd, Celeste had some unusual cramps, so she called the doctor, and we were instructed to go into the office the next morning for a blood test and ultrasound. The blood test turned up positive. It was a happy coincidence that the 24th happened to be my birthday as well. Which brings us to today (August 9th). Today, we had another ultrasound, and we now know that she is carrying twins. At six weeks, they are still tiny (only about 3mm long) but you can still their hearts beating. Quite incredible, when you think about it.

Now, all this is big news, but I want to reassure you that I intend to keep on with S.O.B. just like usual, or at least as much as I can get away with. Celeste is due sometime in March (it's harder to judge the due date with twins, but it's usually about a month less than normal), so things might get a bit hectic at that time. I'll adjust as needed, but I have no intention of folding as long as there are players willing to play here.

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Tokyo: Although it possesses no coastline, nor even a large lake, the Empire of Milan has reemerged after a period of abstention, as an active member of the International Whaling commission, and looks set to obtain the right the right for Milanese to catch whales using scientific violence. Most other maritime nations have rigorously opposed Milanese efforts to re-establish commercial whaling, after the years of intense diplomacy it took to impose the moratorium some decades ago. It will be recalled that after Milanese funded whalers had ruthlessly plundered the Mediterranean of its cetacean inhabitants, popular anger over Milanese maritime aggression was stirred to boiling point by unauthorized Milanese use of arquebus-tipped harpoons. After many years of negotiations behind closed doors, the Milanese conceded their right to whale by default. Those who listened at the keyholes of the closed doors, reported high-pitched screaming by the Milanese delegation, accompanied by heavy dull thuds, and the crackling of fire. Occasionally smoke would issue out from under these same closed doors, or seared meat could be smelt. Medici-run newspapers reported on the happy barbeques that closed such events, but the Milanese delegation invariably had to be carried out on a stretcher, which the press explained as heavy carousing.

The meetings took their toll on the Milanese like on no other delegation, and Milan was soon unable to obtain anyone, even under threat of imprisonment, to join its delegation to the IWC meetings. The maritime nations were able to muster the unanimous vote needed to ban whaling entirely. But now, a generation later, the Milanese young have forgotten why their fathers never talk of the heady days of Milanese whaling delegations, and some volunteered after only minor bruising to attend the latest IWC conference. It seems these young delegates have been able to extract a concession to selective Milanese scientific whaling, under the condition that Milan obtains a coast. This concession was obtained, it is rumored, but heavy bribing of the smaller, poorer delegations. Montferrat was the first to succumb to the irresistible Milanese largesse, and has since voted entirely according to the wishes of the Milanese delegation's leader. France, Florence and Venice, long the main powers opposing commercial whaling have started their own financio-military campaign to ensure the voting goers no further in Milan's favor, by holding the delegations of Savoy, Sienna and Ferrara at knifepoint. Even the Turkish delegation has managed to put Ragusa's team under their thumb. The next round of meetings in Summer and autumn this year will be very interesting indeed for analysts around the Mediterranean.

New Questions

Topic: Brain Teasers

Pedagoguery

It is humbling to look out into the universe and realize just how little of it that we see. In all of the vast spaces, the bright galaxies and glowing clouds of gas represent only a small fraction of what is actually out there. Precisely what the universe is primarily made of is still a matter of some debate, but new evidence is coming to light that gives us a hint of what it might be.

There are a number of ways scientists can constrain what the universe is made of and what its properties are. However, before I go into that, I want to review some principals of geometry and how they apply to the universe as a whole. General Relativity tell us that matter and energy cause space to curve. Now, applying the simplest solutions of General Relativity to the universe as a whole, we learn that this curvature can take on three different characteristics. It can be positive, negative, or zero. A universe with a positive curvature has been likened to the surface of a sphere. Given a large enough triangle, if you add up the degrees, you get a number larger than 180. Take for instance the Earth. If you were to draw a triangle starting at the North Pole down to the Equator, then along the Equator one quarter of the way along the circumference, then back up to the North Pole, you have a triangle with 270 degrees in its three angles. In the same way, parallel lines in such a universe converge eventually, like lines of longitude on the Earth converge at the poles. Using the equations of General Relativity, this state of affairs is reached when the matter and energy density of the universe is higher than that which is required to eventually stop and reverse the expansion of the universe.

At the opposite extreme, a negatively curved universe has been compared to a saddle. In it, a large enough triangle would have less than 180 degrees in its angles and parallel lines would gradually diverge. The zero curvature case is what astronomers term a "flat" universe in that it is precisely Euclidean. Now, through observation, we can tell that the universe is either flat or nearly so. We can tell this for a number of reasons. First of all, if the universe were too highly curved, we would not be here to observe it. In other words, if the universe had too high a positive curvature, it would already have re-collapsed and if the universe had too high a negative curvature, matter would have been flying apart too fast for stars, galaxies, and planets to have formed. In addition, there are theoretical reasons to believe in a flat universe. Most inflationary models predict that the universe is flat. What does it mean to be flat, however? It means that the total matter and energy in the universe is exactly enough to bring the expansion of the universe to a halt in an infinite period of time.

So, how does the universe stack up? Given the measured rate of expansion, we can calculate what the average density of the universe should be if the universe was flat. This critical density is denoted by the capital Greek letter omega (Ω). If Ω is equal to 1, the universe is flat. Astronomers have taken a detailed census of the visible matter in the universe, which is mainly stars and glowing gas. If this matter is all there is, then Ω is only about 0.01-0.02. However other evidence indicates that there is considerably more to the universe than we can see.

One of the first clues that much of the matter in the universe was dark arose out of the study of the rotation of spiral galaxies. Taking a spectrum of a galaxy, and measuring the shift in spectral lines gives us an indication of how different parts of the galaxy are moving. What was discovered was surprising. The outer parts of every galaxy studied were moving far faster than could be accounted for by just the gravity from the visible matter. Each galaxy had to have a spherical halo of dark matter that contained at least 10 times the matter of the visible component of the galaxy. But, the discovery didn't stop there. Studies of galaxy clusters showed that the individual galaxies were moving so fast, they would long ago have escaped the gravitational pull of the cluster unless there was far more matter in the cluster than we could see. Again, the dark matter had to account for some 10 times more matter than the visible component. In addition, studies of gravitational lenses provide some insight into this. Recall that according to General Relativity, the path of light can be bent by a massive object. Gravitational lenses occur when a massive object, such as a galaxy, appears in front of a more distant object, the light from that distant object can be bent. The results of this depend on the particular geometry of the situation. Usually, the result is two or more images of the distant object. Also, if the distant object varies its light output on short time scales, the differences in the length of the different light paths can tell us how massive the lensing object is. Studies of all of these phenomena, plus several others, have constrained the total matter density of the universe to be about $\Omega=0.3$.

What is the dark matter? There are several candidates, and I will be spending the next several issues describing them in more detail.
